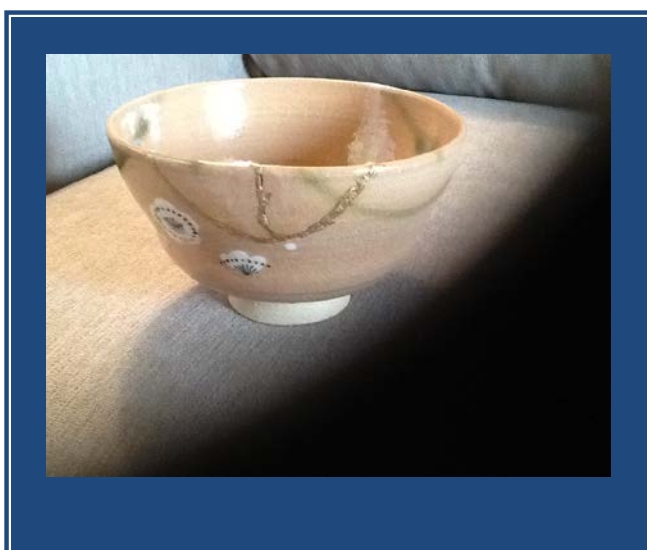


Kintsugi Workshop

Kintsugi is a Japanese traditional way of repairing broken and chipped ceramic with lacquer or resin to cover the fixed area with gold. Kintsugi literally means “Joining with Gold”. Japanese Tea Ceremony started in 14th century, and ceramic and pottery ware were used as tea utensils. The technique of Kintsugi became useful to restore the precious wares, and often after the fixture with Kintsugi, the wares provide more interesting appearance. Tea practitioners treasure and love the wares. Some of them became national treasures.

In Japan, there are quite a few artists and craftsmen who work on Kintsugi. The artist, Joe Weaver has learned such a technique while his living in Japan.

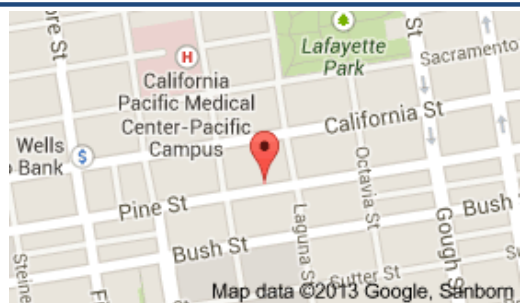
